


orn 1980 on the Isle of Man, British Isles, Mairi is an artist living and working from her studio in Launceston, Tasmania. Mairi has travelled throughout Asia and Europe and these travels have had a strong influence on her paintings. In 2011 she completed a Masters of Fine Arts at the University of Tasmania, receiving an Australian postgraduate award to complete it.

Mairi exhibits regularly across Australia and well as many International overseas shows. Mairi has received many grants to support her art practice through Arts Tasmania, Tasmanian Regional Arts & the Australia Council for the Arts. She has had paintings selected for five public art commissions. Mairi has been a finalist in a number of art prizes including the Glover painting prize four times.

Mairi paints intuitively, as a response to the environments she lives in, from the perspective that she is inseparable from it. The paintings are abstract works composed of intricate layers of overlapping and interlocking forms and colours. The works are not intended to be visually representative of anything in particular. The paintings are moments of personal freedom. They are about being present and in the moment and how a place makes her feel Ward explains "The paintings are a form of abstract expressionism and reflect my inner and outer world". Recent works "Represent shifts in my life and emotions," she says. "Painting is a way for me to process, learn about and become more comfortable with myself and how I am situated in the broader scheme of things."



areth Edwards is a contemporary landscape and seascape painter. He is a graduate of Goldsmiths College, an elected RWA Academician, and is a resident of St Ives' historic Porthmeor Studios.

Demonstrating a powerful approach to process and the materiality of paint, Gareth's work invites us to contemplate ideas of the human 'journey'- our physical journey through time and space, and our psychological journey of existence. At their heart, his paintings aspire to a state of beauty and to what the artist describes as 'emotional weather', exploring equivalents in external environment and internal atmosphere.

"Contemporary Landscape painting has it's detractors, but I believe it remains full of potential. My work considers the meaning and metaphor of natural forces, in the tradition of Constable and Turner, artists who recognised the power, beauty and grace of nature and humanity's relationship with it."

Gareth was selected in 2017 to represent the UK at the Farindola Contemporary Arts Festival in Italy and was awarded the David Simon Contemporary Art prize in 2016/17.

He has been described as a contemporary artist of Abstract Landscape Painting and has just been commissioned to write a book titled 'Abstract Landscape Painting' due to be published in March 2020 with the Crow Wood Press.

He has also had several one man sculpture shows, most recently CLOUD, a sculptural installation at the Internationally renowned Newlyn Art Gallery with a published catalogue by the Spectator Magazine's Arts Editor, Laura Gascoigne and has curated a huge installation of an entire arts library in the Exchange building in Penzance called an Exchange of Ideas.

Laura Gascoigne has described his paintings as being made "...of stardust and mud". He has also been described as a Turner for our times in the Galleries Magazine and he continues to make poetically abstracted landscape paintings that transport the viewer to beautifully contemplative spaces.

t the core of Rosendale's work is the exploration of the past, and the ability to re-tell those images in a contemporary and cinematic language. These vignettes are at once familiar and obscure, reaching into realms of the viewer's collective memory. A crystalline assertion of outstanding draftsmanship and the bravura technique of masterful painting, are trademarks of Rosendale's oeuvre. Episodic images are then transformed into something much more than the original images could ever create. They are imbued with mystery. There is alchemy at work here..."

"Rosendale draws upon a tradition that's all around us. Like Cartier-Bresson, and Hopper, he captures the everyday. As an archivist, he tirelessly trawls the collective subconscious, and discarded fragments of memory. Equipped with his eye for the compositional, he juxtaposes iconography into something intransigent and thrilling. His is the master of cinematic subterfuge. By retelling a good story and enhancing it with the indefinable sense of "what if?", you feel that you are privy to something private, intimate and special. 

A chance for reflection and reprieve in an over stimulated world



ichael Ciavarella is a ceramic artist, art teacher, cultural ambassador and entrepreneur. As curator and director of The Matchbox Show, he creates a platform for artists and ceramic enthusiasts alike to come together from all around the world. Michael is an advocate for cultural understanding through art and communicates such meaning in his artwork. His concepts incorporate national heritage and identity. As an art teacher he broadens students minds technically and theoretically. Creating a practical and professional environment for which emerging artists can elaborate on.

Michaels latest works explore identity and visual silence through abstract expressionism. A chance for reflection and reprieve in an over stimulated world.

The Reflection Room

The *Reflection Room* Installation offers viewers a unique experience into an entirely silent world. Built from windows and mirrors and blackened to create a dark cell in which to block out any external environment, the *Reflection Room* allows just that, time to reflect. So little priority is made to just sit and be present with one's thoughts, ponder and meander one's own mind totally uncorrupted. In this installation Michael gives you a glimpse into what it feels like to enter a minimalist painter's reality. Contrary to our current and over stimulated world, reflection time is simple, solitude vital. What you will see and feel inside and think of is entirely your own experience. Inspired by only your own thoughts. No social media, advertising images, movies or stimuli to prompt or provoke you. Just you. Look at yourself, a projection of you in these mirrors. Are you who you say you are? Do you recognise the person staring back at you? Did you see all you needed to see?



Behind a precise description of reality, there is a meditated story, which each one can read his own way



hrough contemporary bronze and iron sculpture, I have achieved my own style, personal iconography and methodology. My universe includes symbolic elements: maps, globes, staircases, seas of methacrylate, books... The details of my characters present situations and frames that are to be read in depth and complicity, which allows me to capture abstract concepts, feelings, sensations and everything that flows inside my inner world.

Sometimes I try to transform everyday dilemmas into something beautiful: with a little artwork, that captures the beauty of a moment. I confess that a point of intrigue can be breathed in some of my sculptures. They show stories, dreams and illusions and I try to approach them subtly. The main character of my stories are very everyday elements and situations that show snapshots full of emotions and feelings of the journey of life: women taking their time to decide at a crossroads of their life, men enjoying their moments of relaxation, small pleasures, moments of pause, meditation, little epiphanies... Behind a precise description of reality, there is a meditated story, which each one can read his own way...

I develop theses creations on both, full bronze sculptures or a hang on the wall iron and bronze artworks. For the hang on the wall sculptures, I play with the shape of the iron that provides a context to the bronze figure. I also create hang in the wall sculptures based on iron bars with a more minimal appearance, this allows me to play with the space in the wall in order to provide a context that gives more relevance to the story.

I have unique influence from the fashion design world in the way I manage details and the origin of some of the iconography. I sculpt cold wax instead of warm in order to achieve it. The results are maps with detailed folds, cameras in action, swimsuits, contemporary shoes and suitcases that trigger experiences.



work exclusively with the human form in bronze and glass. I have discovered an original language and my personal response to the nude form.

The human body is a subject much explored in the history of art, I feel confident that I have developed something totally new and unique. I focus on the abstract qualities, reducing the form to elegant curves and angles making each body appear simultaneously both weightless and grounded.

I love working with the human form and find the shape, movement and expression that can be achieved by stylising, exciting and inspirational. I feel the blend of movement, abstraction and balance challenging and I enjoy exploring where this challenge will lead.

I consider my work to be stylised and am very much influenced by the classical heroic figurative form. I want my work to be about about form and mood and hopefully viewers are compelled to touch and feel the lines for themselves.

I have found working with the male form a particularly interesting challenge - how to stylise without parody and how to simplify shape the movement that is uniquely male.

I rarely use any armatures or structure when creating my pieces as they are too restricting. Often the piece I am working on has been triggered by a scribble and it does not really have form until I have played around and developed it. There is a price to pay for this – there has been many a morning when I come back into my studio to find the piece has broken or tipped over during the night. Rarely does it destroy the piece – it just creates a new version and even a different direction.

I also like to maintain some irreverence in both form and naming to balance the traditional medium of bronze. I enjoy introducing some attitude into the pose as well as using iconic Aussie names such as Johnno and Bruce to name the work.

I really do love it when something about my work, be it the subject or the naming, brings a smile to peoples faces.

Flappers cut their hair in sharp bold styles, smoked, wore makeup, partied and generally lived each day for the day. I hoped to capture some of this rebellion against the old fashioned ideas of the good girl who was expected to be modest and demure by depicting more languid, indulgent and flirty characters.



Wait-a-Wile

The idea for this piece is about expectations when waiting for someone or something – looking forward to the arrival. For now, the figure is happy waiting, happy looking forward to whoever or whatever is coming & not yet bored. Will this change? What will make it change?

he elemental nature of ceramics, quite obvious in the process and often evident in better pieces, is what I most appreciate after 40 years of practice. Ceramics is the art of earth, water and fire, and dealing in such a fundamental way with these elements, (as one does for example in a three to five day wood firing), has the potential to become an invaluable cathartic experience. I am also appreciative of those people who buy art, who by placing the work in its environment, realise the full potential of each piece, and afford artists like myself to continue making. My work is in numerous private collections, particularly in Australia, New Zealand, the United States, Austria and Japan. Additionally, I am represented in more than a dozen public collections around Australia and have won approximately 20 awards, taught ceramics extensively, and was awarded a Master of Arts (by research) from Monash University."

Rowley Drysdale, known as one of Australia's foremost ceramic artists, was born in outback Queensland in 1957 and the land remains a central inspiration in his artwork. His studio, 'Quixotica', is located at Cooroy on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland, where his anagama kilns are fired several times each year.

Rowley's creative energy is divided between vessel orientated ceramics, and wall works combining clay and mixed media. He has long been recognised as an ambassador for Australian wood fired ceramics and has forged significant relationships with other renowned international potters, particularly in South Korea.

Rowley has also been a highly respected lecturer and tertiary educator of visual arts for more than 20 years on the Sunshine Coast.
